

Dear Mr. Yu Jixin,

The Viet Nam Meteorological and Hydrological Administration presents its compliments to the Typhoon Committee for the support and collaboration in the natural disaster forecasting, warning and prevention; contributing to the human life protection, socio-economic development and response to climate change in the community.

Tropical Cyclone named LINFA (TS 2015) is formed in the middle of Bien Dong Sea in the early of October 11th, 2020 and had been landed around 10 am of the same day on the Central region of Viet Nam. Catastrophic floods, flash floods and landslides caused by heavy rainfalls when LINFA made landfall and afterward have strongly impacted to the whole Central region of Viet Nam from October 10th 2020 to the present. A rapid assessment has been carried out at 17:00 pm of October 26th 2020 as follow:

- 148 deaths and missing; 1009 houses has been collapsed; 121,694 houses have been inundated caused huge human life losses and in danger in the Central region;
- 1.418 hectares of rice and 7.871 hectares of crops were damaged; Hundreds of thousands of livestock died caused the massive agricultural economy severely damage in the Central region.

Because of the massive losses of human life and assets, Viet Nam Meteorological and Hydrological Administration would like to request you to carry out procedures for the retirement of the name of Tropical Cyclone LINFA as the regulation.
